## ORDINANCE NO. 1 CITY OF IACEY

AN ORDINANCE DECLARING THE INCORPORATION OF THE CITY OF LACEY, WASHINGTON, AND THE ELECTION OF OFFI CERS THEREOF

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LACEY DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That pursuant to the laws of the State of Washington, at the regular general election held on the 8th day of November 1966, within the boundaries of the area hereinafter described, the qualified electors, by a majority of the votes cast for the proposal of incorporating the city of Lacey as a city of the third class, voted that said area be incorporated as a city of the third class; that said area is described as follows:

That portion of Thurston County, Washington, described as follows:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LACEY, WASHINGTON, AS FOLLOWS:

(1) That the proposition for the incorporation of the city of Lacey as a city of the third class, having an estimated population of 8806 inhabitants, is hereby declared to have carried in said general election, having received a majority of all votes cast on said proposition and said City of Lacey is hereby declared to be incorporated as a city of the third class, comprised of the following territory:

Beginning at the Southwest corner of Thurston County
Fire Protection District No. 3 to an intersection of the east
City Limits of Olympia, in Section 25, Township 18 North,
Range 2 West, W.M.; thence Easterly along the Southern line
of said Section 25 to the Southwest corner of Section 30,
Township 18 North, Range 1 West W.M.; thence easterly along
the soutern line of said Section 30 to the southwest corner
of Section 29, in said township; thence easterly along the
southern line of Section 29 to the southwest corner of
Section 28, in said township; thence easterly along the
southern line of said Section 28 to the southwest corner of
Section 27, in said township; thence easterly along the
southern line of said Section 27 to its intersection with the
westerly margin of Carpenter Road, near the southeast corner
of said Section 27; thence northerly and westerly along the
western margin of Carpenter Road to the center line of Secondary

State Highway #510; thence northerly along the western margin of Carney Road to its intersection with the southern margin of Draham Road; thence southerly and westerly along the south margin of the Draham Road extended westerly to an intersection with the easterly margin of N.E. 36th Street (Lilly Road); thence southerly along the eastern margin of 36th Street to the center line of Secondary State Highway #510 (Pacific Avenue; thence easterly along the center line of said highway to its intersection with the westerly right of way of the Chehalis Western Railway Company; thence southerly along the said westerly right of way to the southeast corner of the northwest quarter of the northwest quarter of Section 20, Township 18 North, Range 1 West, W.M.; thence westerly to the city limits of Olympia; thence along said city limits to the point of beginning.

(2) That the following named persons are declared to be the duly elected officers of the city of Lacey, under the Mayor-Council form of government, and entitled to assume office on the first Monday following issuance of the certificate of election by the county auditor, and shall continue in office until their successors are elected and qualified at the next general municipal election to be held on the first Tuesday after the First Monday in November in each odd numbered year, which said election would follow the primary election on the third Tuesday of September in each odd numbered year:

Sec. 2. That the following seven candidates for the office of city councilman received the highest number of votes at the aforesaid general election: Carl R. Anderson, Ira Grant, T. W. Huntamer, Richard Jones, W. W. (Hap) Kemp, Malcolm McKenzie and Richard Webb.

Sec. 33. That the candidate A. G. Homann received the highest number of votes cast at the aforesaid general election for the office of Mayor.

- Sec. 4. That the candidate Claudia Holder received the highest number of votes cast for the position of clerk at the aforesaid general election.
- Sec. 5. That the candidate Charles Wagner, received the highest number of votes cast at the aforesaid general election for the office of City Treasurer.
- Sec. 6. That the candidate, John R. Kramer, received the highest number of votes cast at the aforesaid general election for the office of City attorney.
- Sec. 7. That the Board of County Commissioners of Thurston

  County, Washington on the 5th day of December, 1966, duly passed a resolution declaring that the area described in Sec. 1 herein was incorporated as a city of the third class, declaring the election of the persons named in Sec. 2 herein as city councilmen for said incorporated area; declaring the person named in Sec. 3 herein as the Mayor of the city of Lacey; declaring the person named in Sec. 4, as the city clerk; declaring the person named in Sec. 5 as the city treasurer; declaring the person named in Sec. 6 as the city attorney; that the aforesaid resolution was duly entered in the minutes of the said Board of County Commissioners on the 5th day of December, 1966, and filed in the office of the Secretary of State on the 5th day of December, 1966.

Sec. 8. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after its passage, approval and publication.
