## CITY OF LACEY

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE STORING AND DISPOSAL OF GARBAGE AND REFUSE AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LACEY DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. All persons, associations, and corporations in the City of Lacey shall store and dispose of garbage and refuse in the manners prescribed in this ordinance.

Section 2. For the purpose of this ordinance, the following definitions shall apply:

- A. Garbage The term garbage shall include all putrescible wastes, except sewage and body
  wastes and shall include all such substances
  from all public, private estabishments, and
  from all residences.
- B. Refuse The term refuse shall include garbage,
  rubbish, ashes, and all other putrescible and
  non-putrescible wastes except sewage and body
  wastes from all public and private establishments.

Section 3. Garbage and refuse shall be stored in containers of types approved by the Health Officer or other person designated by the Mayor of the City of Lacey. Such containers shall be water-tight with raised bottoms and fitted with a tight cover and must be readily emptied or transported to dump sites without spillage. Provided further that dry refuse may be placed in cartons and stored neatly in such a manner that it will not lead to the loss or distribution of said refuse in the City.

Section 4. All persons, associations and corporations shall dispose of all garbage and refuse through the use of licenses garbage and refuse contractors, or by other means approved by the Health Officer or agent in accordance with State of Washington Health Standards such as burial, hauling to sanitary land-fills, etc.

Section 5. Violations of this ordinance shall be punishable





by a fine of not over One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for each violation, or imprisonment for thirty (30) days, or both.

Section 6. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after its passage, approval and publication.
