ORDINANCE NO. 256

CITY OF LACEY

AN ORDINANCE DESIGNATING FOUR LANE STREETS WITHIN THE CITY OF LACEY, PROHIBITING PARKING, AND DECLARING THE VIOLATION OF SAID PROHIBITION TO BE A MISDEMEANOR, AND ADDING A NEW CHAPTER TO THE LACEY MUNICIPAL CODE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LACEY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. There is hereby added to the Lacey Municipal Code, Chapter 12.10 to read as follows:

12.10.010 The following streets or portions of streets within the City of Lacey are hereby designated as four lane streets:

- (1) College Street from Martin Way to 13th Avenue S.E.;
- (2) All of Sleater-Kinney Road lying within the City of Lacey from the most northerly city limit line to 11th Avenue S.E.;
- (3) Pacific Avenue from the westerly city limit line to its intersection with the westerly end of Lacey Boulevard;
- (4) Lacey Boulevard from Ruddell Road west to the westerly end of Lacey Boulevard at its intersection with Pacific Avenue;
- (5) Martin Way from the west city limit line to the east city limit line.
- 12.10.020 There shall be no parking on any of the four lanes on those streets designated as four lane streets by 12.10.010.
- 12.10.030 Any person who violates the provisions of this chapter shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

Section 2. This ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety, and shall take effect immediately upon its passage and publication.
