

ORDINANCE NO. 413

CITY OF LACEY

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO HOLIDAYS WITH PAY FOR CITY EMPLOYEES, REPEALING SECTION 2.56.180 OF THE LACEY MUNICIPAL CODE AND ENACTING IN PLACE THEREOF A NEW SECTION 2.56.180.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LACEY DOES ORDAIN
AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 2.56.180 of the Lacey Municipal Code is hereby repealed.

Section 2. There is adopted a new Section 2.56.180 of the Lacey Municipal Code to read as follows:

The following and such other days as the City Council, by resolution, may fix are holidays for all regularly employed full-time employees of the city: the first day of January, commonly called New Year's Day; the twelfth day of February, being the anniversary of the birth of Abraham Lincoln; the third Monday of February, being celebrated as the anniversary of the birth of George Washington; the last Monday of May, commonly known as Memorial Day; the fourth day of July, being the anniversary of the Declaration of Independence; the first Monday in September, to be known as Labor Day; the eleventh day of November, to be known as Veterans' Day; the fourth Thursday in November, to be known as Thanksgiving Day; the day immediately following Thanksgiving Day; and the twenty-fifth day of December, commonly called Christmas Day.

When one of the holidays falls on a Saturday or Sunday, such holiday will be observed on the next work day

following the holiday, provided that however, the department head shall grant some employees the normal working day before the holiday rather than the day following in order to maintain normal office hours of his department.

All regularly employed full-time employees of the city shall be entitled to one paid holiday per calendar year in addition to those specified in this section. Each employee may select the day on which the employee desires to take the additional holiday provided for herein after consultation with and approval of the department head.
