A RESOLUTION INCREASING THE SPEED LIMIT ON COLLEGE STREET FROM MARTIN WAY TO SIXTH AVENUE N.E.

WHEREAS, College Street from Martin Way north to Sixth Avenue N.E. has recently been extensively upgraded and widened to provide for safer travel and it has been determined on the basis of engineering and traffic investigation, that the maximum speed permitted by state law and further the maximum speed previously set by Resolution No. 230 of the City of Lacey on that portion of College Street from Martin Way north to Sixth Avenue N.E. is less than reasonable and safe under the conditions now found to exist, now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LACEY, WASHINGTON, as follows:

Section 1. That the speed limit on College Street from Martin Way north to Sixth Avenue N.E. shall be 40 miles per hour.

Section 2. Resolution No. 230 of the City of Lacey setting speed limits on various streets as amended, is further amended to the extent set forth in this Resolution.

Section 3. The speed limit established by this Resolution shall be effective on said street set forth herein at such time as appropriate signs giving notice thereof are erected by the City.
